### Approval of Minutes

Motion to approve the minutes of the September 29, 2015 meeting with attendance correction made by B. Delfs Avra Valley, second by J. Kahle Rincon Valley, motion approved.

## **Treasurer's Report**

Chief Kahle submitted a written report which was distributed to the membership. Chief Kahle provided brief remarks on the report. There were no questions or comments.

## **Presentations:**

1. M. McKendrik made a short presentation to the Pima Chiefs Board in appreciation of the support Pima Chiefs provided during the recent Israeli visit.
2. Dr. Peate Firefighter Cardiac Presentation  
Dr. Peate presented updated information on cardiac study and the benefits of the study. In addition, Dr. Peate thanked the Pima Chiefs for their support with the new ultrasound that was purchased. To date, seven people have been identified that required invasive and potentially lifesaving and definitely career saving procedures.

## **Standing Committee Reports**

1. Training  
G. Roberts (Rural/Metro) representing C. Ader, reported that winter officer retreat changed to January 14<sup>th</sup>. In addition, the name of the retreat has been changed to the PITC Winder Leadership Symposium. Topics to be included: mental health, cancer, and leadership. A suggestion was made to reconsider the date of this retreat based on the many activities scheduled at that time.
2. Southern Arizona Safety Officers  
No formal report. Chief Canale presented a brief update on Safety Day and asked if there was interest in having Dr. Rich Gasaway, potential presenter at Safety Day, stay over and present another lecture the Monday after Safety Day. Discussion occurred on participation levels and it was decided more research would be done before committing.

## **Other Reports**

- EMS  
Chief Crouse provided a written report. He also mentioned that PCC is revamping their CEP Preceptor criteria. He suggests that each agency should evaluate this new change and how it impacts their respective agency.

- **Fire Marshals**  
No report. Chief Karrer did mention that the state has approved the new State Fire Code. This code is now under the 2012 ICC and has very few amendments.
- **Legislative Update**  
No formal report. S. Davis advised that AFDA is working on legislative agenda and that pension reform and tax cap continue to be a priority items. R. Karrer advised that NWFD is hosting a legislative day on December 2<sup>nd</sup> and encouraged everyone to participate.
- **Office of Emergency Management Update-** J. Guthrie advised that on December 16<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am- Noon, both EOC teams will be gathering at Pima County EOC for a tabletop exercise. drill. This will be an opportunity for both teams to work together. In addition, Guthrie mentioned that OEM is creating an emergency information website to share information with the public and encouraged everyone to check back frequently for information.
- **Arizona Fire Chiefs Update**  
No report. Chief Karrer advised that AZ Chiefs is working on strategic planning currently.
- **Wildland Response Zones Update**  
J. Etshokin advised that the Tucson District will be expanding its boundaries north up to the Tonto National Forest boundary. He also advised that with some of the area changes that Gene Beaudoin will be moving up to be the manager of the NE District. This change should take place in June and the Tucson District will be working on a replacement. He also advised that the Tucson District Office is moving to a new location off of Dodge on 43<sup>rd</sup> Place. Last, he advised that a frequency change is coming on the Coronado National Forest. The frequencies will be released soon.
- **Statewide Mutual Aid**  
D. Crouse provided an update on the recent Statewide Mutual Aid exercise held in Sierra Vista. He stated that there were many lessons learned and opportunities for improvement were identified. One of the largest needs identified was a reliable resource list. This committee will be working to put this resource list together.
- **Greater Tucson Fire Foundation**

M. McKendrick once again thanked everyone for the hospitality and support that was provided during the recent Israeli visit. In addition, he mentioned that the cost of the visit was all self-funded. He noted that the GTFFF has completed its 2016 calendar and identified its major initiatives for the coming year. Last, he reminded everyone of the upcoming retiree breakfast on December 15<sup>th</sup> and encouraged everyone to RSVP to the GTFFF if attending.

T. Canale: Reminded everyone that FF license plates are available in support of the AZ. State Fire Training Committee. These plates can be ordered through ADOT. DM promoted a new BC recently. Last, Canale asked for suggestions for topics for the Chief's symposium later in 2016.

Chief Garcia: Reminded everyone that TFD will be hosting a five-week Hazmat Class followed by a five-week TRT class. Classes are tentatively scheduled to start sometime in February. More details to come soon.

**FIREFIGHTERS BEYOND BORDERS**  
**Greater Tucson Fire Foundation**  
**2015 Israeli Representatives Visit**

In October of 2015, the Greater Tucson Fire Foundation (GTFF), in partnership with the Jewish Federation of Southern Arizona, Weintraub Israel Center and the Jewish Community Foundation, sponsored five (5) representatives from various Israeli emergency response agencies. This visit was a follow-up to the 2013 visit to Israel by seven Tucson area firefighters that studied Israeli best practices in response to mass casualty and terrorism events. That visit resulted in significant changes in regional cooperation in training and response procedures, as well as emergency medical response triage protocols. Due to the success of that trip, GTFF wanted to build on these ideas by bringing to the Tucson area individuals with broad experience in emergency response operations and incident command, as well as having policy-making and decision-making authority, in order to discuss how those policies became institutionalized in the Israeli national culture. With the aid of the Israeli consulate in Los Angeles, Yaki Lopez, GTFF was able to host the five representatives for a total of eleven (11) days, including travel days. The five representatives and their respective agencies were:

- Lt. Colonel Ariel Blitz, Israeli Defense Force Home Front Command. Home Front Liaison in the United States.
- Abraham Borger, the policy director for the Israel Emergency Management Authority.
- Guy Caspi, the chief instructor for response to multi casualty and hazardous materials incidents for Magen David Adom, Israel's national EMS service.
- Major Sivan Inbar, Israeli Defense Force Home Front Command. Chief Training Officer responsible for the development and implementation of training programs for civilians/volunteers and community response teams.
- Brigadier General Shmulik Friedman, Head of the Operations Department of the Israel Fire and Rescue Authority, and the Deputy Commander of the Judea & Samaria Fire Authority District.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the 2015 visit was twofold.

1. Continue and expand the discussions and activities that resulted from the 2013 trip to a wider and more diverse audience here in the greater Tucson area.
2. Share with the Israeli delegation various aspects of Southern Arizona's emergency response procedures.

## OBJECTIVES

The specific topics that the Israeli delegation was asked to speak to were:

1. Civilian emergency response.
2. Emergency medical response and mass casualty triage procedures.
3. Emergency and follow-up response to terrorist attacks.
4. Interaction among multiple emergency response agencies.
5. Psychological versus physiological trauma triage and care.

In addition, prior to coming to Tucson, the Israeli delegation listed several topics that they wished to be reviewed. These topics included:

1. Urban search and rescue.
2. Volunteer/Paid firefighter integration.
3. Wildland firefighting.
4. Helicopter operations in rescue and firefighting.
5. Hazardous materials response.
6. Officer training and development.
7. Incident management and command centers.
8. Responder health and safety.

## RESULTS

During the course of the hosted visit, the delegation conducted formal and semi-formal presentations covering the GTFF's stated objectives in the following venues. These topics were also addressed in informal sessions at various agencies during site visits.

- Open meeting at the Jewish Community Center.
- Seminar with panel discussion to the emergency response community at the Jewish Community Center. More than 100 responders from across the state attended.
- Met with the Pima County Fire Chiefs at Tucson Fire Department Station One.
- Meeting with the Santa Cruz County emergency response community.
- Meeting with the Arizona State Department of Emergency Management.
- Meeting with Davis Monthan Air Force command personnel.
- Meeting with Raytheon fire and management personnel.

The objectives identified by the Israeli delegation were met in the following venues:

Objective 1 - Phoenix Fire Department discussed its National Urban Search and Rescue Team. Pima County Sheriff Department presented on its Rural Search and Rescue Team.

Objective 2 - Rincon Valley Fire District and Rio Rico Fire District presented on volunteer/paid firefighter integration.

Objective 3 and 4 – Mount Lemmon Fire District and Northwest Fire District presented on wildland firefighting. The Arizona Department of Public Safety and the United States Border Patrol brought their rescue/firefighting helicopters to this presentation.

Objective 5 - Rincon Valley Fire District hosted the Pima County Hazardous Materials Response Vehicle during the site visit.

Objective 6 – The Northwest Fire District sponsored a session on Blue Card Command Tactics and Strategy Training as well as a demonstration of its Battalion Chief Fireground Simulation. The Tucson Fire Department conducted a live-burn to demonstrate the latest National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) studies on firefighting that have been incorporated into the Tucson Fire Department's standard operating procedures.

Objective 7 – Pima County Emergency Management conducted a tour of the Pima County Emergency Operations Center. The Arizona Department of Emergency Management conducted a tour of the Arizona Emergency Operations Center. The Phoenix Fire Department conducted a tour of its Communication Center. The Tucson Fire Department hosted a lunch at its Command Center located at its administration building.

Objective 8 – Doctor Wayne Peate of Well America conducted a tour of his facility. Tucson Fire Captain John Gullota led a discussion on recent cancer studies. The Phoenix Fire Department conducted a tour of its Health Center.

In addition, the delegation visited Nogales to review border control issues. This was sponsored by the Rio Rico Fire Department and the United States Border Patrol. The delegation toured Tucson International Airport, and the University of Arizona ASTEC EMS patient simulation lab.

During the course of the eleven days, the delegates met with several local political, business and religious leaders during hosted meals and similar events.

It should be noted that as a direct result of the planning for this visit, an additional seminar concerning Post Incident Stress Disorder was conducted on May 14, 2015 at the Jewish Community Center. This seminar featured Doctor Eyal Fruchter, a noted Israeli specialist in the field of psychological health. Several other local subject matter experts presented as well. Doctor Fruchter was made available through the efforts of Yaki Lopez of the Israeli Consulate Office. Approximately 130 responders from around the state attended this event.



## DISCUSSION

The stated objectives of both the GTFF and the Israeli delegation were met, albeit some to a greater degree than others. It is also safe to say that the Israeli delegation learned more about the emergency operations in Southern Arizona than the Southern Arizona responders learned about Israeli operations.

Both the seminar featuring the delegates and the associated PTSD seminar were very informative and well received. The meetings with the Pima County Fire Chiefs, the Arizona Department of Emergency Management administrative personnel, and the Santa Cruz County Emergency Management personnel and responders were true mutual discussions between subject matter experts.

The NIST demonstration conducted by the Tucson Fire Department, the wildland firefighting presentation conducted by Mount Lemmon and Northwest Fire District, and the officer development presentation and the ‘Pit Crew’ CPR demonstration conducted by the Northwest Fire Department were exceptionally well done.

Each involved agency warmly welcomed the delegation and it was and is noted how much work they each put into preparing for the site visits.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

Where the Firefighters Beyond Borders program goes from here is up for discussion. Should this exchange of personnel continue, it most certainly will need to be conducted with a more specific purpose in mind. As with the 2013 trip, this visit, with so many objectives and venues, was fairly general in nature and, as a result, much of the information that was shared was equally general in nature. This was good for developing good relationships and possibly a continuing partnership, but it is hard for me to come up with any specific best practice that resulted from this visit.

That being said, it is the recommendation of this report to continue this relationship with the Israeli emergency response community with the following caveats:

1. The objectives of any future trip should be pared down and more specific. I think we are at a point now where both parties have a pretty good idea of what the other has to offer. Any future visits, whether it is us going to them or them coming to us, should be designed with a very specific training goal in mind.
2. One agency that was notably missing from this visit was the Tucson Police Department. We should make a greater effort to include them in future events.
3. Both Oshrat Barel of the Weintraub Israel Center and Patty Vallance should be officially recognized for the incredible amount and quality of work that they put into organizing this visit.

### **Cancer Study**

- Cancer is a leading cause of firefighter morbidity and mortality.
- Cancer is the second leading cause of mortality in the fire service (following only cardiovascular disease), and has been responsible for 20-36% of firefighter deaths (Beaumont, et al., 1991; Hansen, 1990). The recent National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) study (Daniels et al., 2014) documented excesses in lung, gastrointestinal and kidney cancer, and other firefighter studies have identified elevated rates of additional cancer types (Monash University, 2014; Pukkala et al., 2014; LeMasters et al., 2006).
- Cancer is a multistage process with a long latency between exposure and the onset of disease, extending from as short as five years to over 30 years (Nadler & Zurbenko, 2014).

Fire Foundation in coordination with Dr.s Wayne Peate and Stephanie Lundell of Well America is providing supportive funding for a pilot study related to cancer and firefighters. The study is specific to the sunny southwest. Public donations or sponsorships are required to initiate the study which could have industry wide impacts.

**Arizona Fire Chiefs Association – Presidential Forum**

On January 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> 2016 I attended the third annual AFCA “Presidential Forum” held in Laughlin, Nevada. As your regional representative I reported on the status of current fire chiefs serving in Pima County and shared with the group the accomplishments and needs from 2015 as well as the challenges for 2016 that were provided by the area Fire Chiefs.

At our meeting some of the following topics were discussed:

**Pension Reform Update**

- Bryan Jefferies & Pete Constant presented on the Public Safety Pension Reform. Included in the presentation was historical information leading to our current pension issues along with proposed changes needed to correct the problems faced in the pension at it stands now. Too much to cover in this update but both Brian Jefferies and Pete Constant would be willing to meet with fire organizations to help educate both management and labor. I recommend that the PFCA support holding a meeting soon for all public safety personnel in the area to include fire department/districts and Law enforcement agencies (TPD, MPD, OVPD, PCSO, etc.) To learn more on this important issue that affects us all. GRFD would be willing to host this meeting.

**AFCA & AFDA conference location/dates**

- Arizona Fire Chiefs Leadership conference and the Arizona Fire District Association conference will be combined this year for the first time.
- The combined Fire & EMS Leadership Conference will be held July 12<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016. The location will be the Renaissance Glendale Hotel and Spa in Glendale, AZ
- Rooms will go quick and are at a reduced rate so register soon.
- There will be a vender show that will be free for your personnel to attend. This is a good time to send your support staff responsible for fire /EMS supplies, vehicle/equipment maintenance and ordering, fire / EMS training, radio communications, IT, etc... This can

be a burn and return day trip requiring no overnight stay. I encourage all to attend and coordinate with other agencies to have support staff car pool and support the vender show.

### **EMS Section – Les Caid**

- There is still a strong focus on the following:
  - Fire Based EMS
  - Mobile Integrated Health Care -Treat and refer programs
  - Fire Organizations seeking to obtain a CON
  - Community Risk Reduction
  - Community Integrated Para-medicine program

### **State Fire Marshal Update – Fred Durham**

- The State has adopted the new 2012 Fire Code
- State Fire Marshal's Office moving under the State Forestry Department
  - Everyone should have already received communication on this issue from the state.

### **L.A.S.T. Update - Pat Abel**

- Team has been in existence approximately 9 plus years
- Team has provided services for at least 11 major calls in 2014, includes thousands of hours of volunteer service
- AZ 100 Club provided funding to purchase and stock two new trailers (1 for Southern AZ and 1 for Northern AZ)
- Developed a Funeral Resource Guide – To assist team and fire departments/districts
- Paul Bourgeois announced is stepping away from the day to day management of L.A.S.T. Rich Kochanski (MFD) will be taking on these duties.
